City Council is back in session following its traditional summer recess. During the recess, the Charter Review Commission finalized its recommendations in Charter changes, which will be voted upon by Bay residents in November. A public hearing will be held October 1st at City Hall at 6:30 p.m. for an explanation of the charter amendments for the public.

Meanwhile, City Council has begun the budgetary process for 2013. A fiscally conservative approach, marked by targeted cuts and restructuring of debt, has allowed the city to operate within its means without dipping into reserves specifically earmarked for public improvements to benefit our Bay Village residents. The Finance Committee is meeting frequently as the budget takes shape.

The Public Improvements Committee is soon beginning a series of meetings with city administration to layout long-term public improvement plans. An aging infrastructure will require investment in municipal buildings, parks and recreation, roads and continued sewer upgrades.
