Temporary Sign at Kiddie Kollege

Mrs. Lieske stated that the sign had toppled over during the recent storm. She asked the timing and the process for a permanent sign. Concerns have been heard from residents about the temporary sign before the storm.

Service Director Galli stated that he will make contact this week with the representatives of Kiddie Kollege and have the sign taken down because it has exceeded the time allowed by the permit for the temporary sign.

Mr. Miller noted that the language of the motion included the ability to keep the temporary sign until a permanent sign is erected.

Law Director Ebert advised that the Cahoon Memorial Park Trustees can, at any point in time, determine that a temporary sign should be replaced with a permanent sign. The trustees can indicate that the intent of the temporary sign was to announce the opening of the school at that location. Now that the school is opened, the temporary sign should be removed. Service Director Galli stated that the original request was for 60 days, and that time has elapsed.

Mrs. Lieske asked if it is safe to assume that the sign will be removed this week. Mr. Galli stated that it will be removed this week.

Mr. Young stated that the Clague Road store signs look worse now than they did before the storm. Mr. Ebert stated that Mr. Galli is going to talk to the business owners about paying for new signage. Mr. Tadych noted that the city installed the original sign. Mr. Young stated that he would like to see the existing sign removed, and since it is a city owned sign the city can remove the sign. Mr. Tadych added that most of the signs in the city are now monument signs.
