**AN ORDINANCE**  
**AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE CHANGE ORDER #1 FOR  
CITI ELECTRIC, INC. FOR EMERGENCY REPAIRS TO THE LONGBEACH AND  
HUNTINGTON SEWERAGE PUMP STATIONS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, the City has an agreement with Citi Electric, Inc. for the emergency repairs to the Longbeach and Huntington Sewerage Pump Stations as authorized by Ordinance No. 12-99 passed November 19, 2012; and

**WHEREAS**, City Electric, Inc. has submitted Change Order No. 1 for approval by the City;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Bay Village, Ohio:

**SECTION 1.** That the Mayor be and she is hereby authorized to execute Change Order No. 1 for Citi Electric, Inc., adding the amount of \$13,064.90 to the cost of said project and bringing the total contract price to \$55,064.90. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to pay the contract price of Fifty Five Thousand, Sixty-four and 90/100 Dollars (\$55,064.90) from the appropriation in the Sewer Equipment Replacement Fund (580.330.55200).

**SECTION 2.** That this Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committee that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with law.

**SECTION 3.** That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to execute said Change Order so that said repair be completed expeditiously, wherefore this ordinance shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
