



## **Bay Village Press Release**

**09/14/2015**

On 09/12/2015, at 1921 hrs, a resident in the 600 block of Marygate called BVPD to report an occupied vehicle had been parked in front of her house for 45 minutes. An officer spoke with the occupants and learned they were just talking and dropping off a friend who lived in the area. They were advised of the complaint.

On 09/12/2015, at 1034 hrs, a student reported that his unlocked mountain bike was stolen from the Middle School. BVPD reminds residents to please lock your bike if left unattended.

On 09/11/2015, at 2128 hrs, BVPD received a call from a resident in the 27000 block of Normandy who reported a suspicious vehicle at the end of his driveway. The resident spoke with the driver who indicated he was looking for Broadview Hts, before driving down the road a short distance and stopping. A BVPD officer spoke with the occupants and suspected one of them was in the country illegally. Border Patrol was contacted and took over the investigation. After Border Patrol spoke with the occupants, it was determined they had the proper documentation, and were sent on their way.

On the morning of 09/11/2015, numerous residents in the 400 block of Oakmoor reported their unlocked vehicles had been entered overnight. Very little was taken. A resident in that block reported that his car was stolen overnight. This car was recovered at the intersection of Oakmoor and Lake (disabled). A resident in the 25000 block of Lake Rd. reported that her cars were entered overnight and one of them was also stolen. Police are investigating and remind residents to lock your vehicles and take any valuables inside.

On 09/10/2015, at 2303 hrs, two juvenile females came to BVPD to report they were approached by a male at Play in Bay who asked them if they wanted to smoke some marijuana. They said "no", and immediately left the park. The male was with a group of his friends and

they all left the park when the girls did. Police checked the area but were unable to locate the male.

Several residents received scam phone calls where the caller pretended to be from the IRS or a long lost relative saying they were in jail and needed bond money. No one lost any money as a result of the calls. BVPD reminds residents not to give out any personal information over the phone.
