



## Bay Village Press Release

**01/22/2018**

The Bay Village Police would like to remind everyone the IRS scammers will be working harder to try to separate you from your money. Someone pretending to be a representative of the IRS may contact you via e-mail and phone calls. Remember you cannot assume this person is actually with the Internal Revenue Service. The IRS will **NOT** contact you by phone or e-mail and they most certainly will **not** ask **you** to provide personal information about yourself in order to verify your identity. Call the IRS directly or the Bay Village Police for assistance and never, EVER give out personal information to an unknown person over the phone or via e-mail.

On 01/15/2018, at 0130 hrs, a BVPD officer attempted to stop a vehicle on Lake Rd. just east of Clague for a traffic violation. The vehicle pulled into a driveway and stopped, at which point the operator got out of the vehicle and began walking towards the house. The officer commanded the driver to stop, but he ignored the commands and entered the house, locking the door behind him. Officers made contact with a resident of the house who led them to her adult son, who was standing in a hallway. Upon seeing officers, the male ran into a room slamming the door behind him. Officers forced the door open, and after a brief struggle took the male into custody. The 28-year old Bay Village resident will face charges for Obstructing Official Business, Resisting arrest, and OVI. He will face charges at RRMCC.

On 01/19/2018, at 0019 hrs, a BVPD officer stopped a vehicle on Elmwood at Lake Rd. for a traffic violation. After speaking with the male driver, the officer suspected he had been drinking. Field sobriety tests were administered, and as a result, the driver was arrested for OVI. The 30-year old Avon Lake resident will face charges at RRMCC.

On 01/19/2018, at 0222 hrs, a resident in the 400 block of Hurst called BVPD to report a male was ringing her doorbell and pounding on her door. Responding officers located four juveniles running around the area. All four will be charged with curfew violations. They will face charges at Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court.

On 01/19/2018, at 2227 hrs, a resident in the 400 block of Fordham called BVPD to report a suspicious vehicle parked in her neighbor's driveway with the driver slumped over the wheel. After waking and speaking to the female driver, officers suspected she had been drinking. Field sobriety tests were administered, and as a result, the 28-year old Cleveland resident was arrested for OVI. She will face charges at RRMC.
