On 04/09/18, at 20:07 hrs, an officer was dispatched to an Upland Road address on a fraud complaint. The victim had received a letter from "Check into Cash" advising of fraudulent activity for \$500. He had also received an e-mail from "Check n Go" reporting an alleged separate fraudulent event. This company included a form, which they asked the victim to fill out and return. The officer noted the form was requesting a lot of personal information. He advised the victim it was probably not a good idea to return the form. Finally, the resident noted that it appeared someone might have opened a bank account in Florida, using the victim's information, in order to obtain a cash advance. Information was taken for a report.

On 04/11/2018, at 01:27 hrs, officers were dispatched to the area of Speedway on Columbia Road to the report of power being out in the area and a possible car crash. The first officer on the scene found a Chevrolet Silverado truck had struck a utility pole in front of the gas station. The male driver exited the vehicle and approached the officer. The male said he was unhurt and had no idea how he went off the road and struck the pole. After noting the smell of an alcoholic beverage about his person, the driver was asked to perform some field sobriety tests. He was arrested after failing the tests. The 31-year old Avon Lake resident was processed back at the station before being released to a sober adult.

On 04/12/2018, at 21:11 hrs, a resident called the station to report she had been walking her 10-month-old Labradoodle in the 28700 block of Osborn Road when a large Saint Bernard and a smaller white fluffy dog left a yard and accosted the complainant and her dog. The 45-year old female received scratches and her dog had been nipped, resulting in bleeding on the left side. The officer did follow-up at the house in question and as a result, the 55-year old female resident was cited for Animal-at-Large.
