Mr. Koomar called the meeting to order at 7:48 p.m. in the conference room of Bay Village City Hall.

Kayak Storage Construction at the Bay Boat Club site

Mr. Doug Gertz, representing the Bay Boat Club, presented plans for the construction of storage for kayaks at the Bay Boat Club site. Mr. Gertz related that the storage is similar to those in the City of Avon Lake, at the boat club located at Route 83 and Lake Road. There have been many requests for kayak storage at the Bay Boat Club site. The club would like to build two units and have a lottery for the spaces available. If there is more demand and it is going well, two additional units will be built. The Sea Scouts will build the units as a group project, and they are guaranteed the first eight compartments. The second eight compartments will be designated through a lottery system. The thought at this point is to charge \$50.00 per year for storage. A release will be signed by the boat owner. The individual kayaks would be secured with a chain and lock. Storage of the kayaks is only available to Bay Boat Club members.

The storage units will be placed behind the sailing building which is the eastern most building on the site. The space will not use any of the parking available; the boats will go into the hillside. The thought at this point is to get the permission of the Board of Trustees for a total of four units, and to build two at this time and two later if there is sufficient demand. There are thirty-three kayak users in the boat club presently. Each rack holds eight kayaks. With the Sea Scouts having eight, this would leave potentially 24 compartments available if four units are built.

Motion by Pohlkamp to approve the design plans for the kayak storage construction at the Bay Boat Club site as presented by Doug Gertz. **Motion carried 7-0.**

There being no further business to come before the Cahoon Memorial Park Trustees, the meeting adjourned at 7:52 p.m.
