02/25/2020

On 02/23/2020, at 1915 hrs, a resident in the 23000 block of Knickerbocker reported there was a suspicious occupied car parked in front of his house. The car had been parked there for some time, and the caller had never seen it before. Upon arrival, the vehicle was unoccupied. Officers located the owner at a nearby residence. He was in the process of moving into a new house and had parked his car in the street.

On 02/24/2020, at 0809 hrs, a BVPD officer stopped a vehicle on Lake Rd. at Lake Park for a traffic violation. After speaking with the 43 yoa male driver, it was suspected the driver did not have a driver's license and the driver and 33-ya female passenger were both in the country illegally. Border Patrol was contacted and confirmed that both the driver and passenger were not residents. They asked that BVPD take both of them into custody and hold them for pickup. While attempting to take the male into custody he resisted arrest. After a brief struggle, the male was handcuffed. The female was taken into custody without incident. Both were turned over to Border Patrol.

On 02/23/2020, at 2345 hrs, at 30 yoa female Cleveland resident came to BVPD to report that her 25-ya sister had fraudulently used her name on a traffic stop in December of 2019. Her sister was stopped for a traffic violation in Bay Village, and as a result was issued a citation, but she gave the wrong name. She did not pay the ticket, which resulted in the complainant's driver's license being suspended. Police are investigating.
