



Bay Village Press Release

On October 7, 2019 at 8:44pm, Bay Village Police received a 911 call reporting that a vehicle had struck a telephone pole in front of a home in the 23000 block of Lake Road. Police arrived on scene and began searching for the vehicle. Officers quickly found the suspect vehicle and who was found committing other moving violations. Police spoke with the female operator, a 32 year-old Garfield Heights resident, who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. The operator failed field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. On station, the operator submitted to an Intoxilyzer test which showed a .313 blood alcohol content. She is facing numerous charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.

On October 8, at 11:40am a Bay Village resident arrived at the police station to report that her car had been “keyed” in the Bay Methodist parking lot on October 3 between the hours of 6pm-8pm. The damage to her vehicle included the whole driver’s side of the vehicle and is going to cost over \$1,500 in repairs.

On October 12, 2019 at around midnight, Bay Village Police stopped a vehicle on Canterbury Road south of Lake Road for a moving violation. Police spoke with the male operator, a 31 year-old Avon Lake resident, who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. The operator failed field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. On station, the operator refused to submit to a breath test. He is facing multiple charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.
