



## **Bay Village Press Release**

On October 27 at 3:31pm, Bay Village Police were dispatched to the parking lot of Cahoon Park Walking Path on report of a male passed out in a vehicle. Officers arrived and spoke with the male, a 31 year-old Elyria resident, who was found to have an active warrant with the Avon Lake Police Department. Officers also discovered marijuana, drug paraphernalia, drug abuse instruments and possible heroin in the vehicle. The male is facing numerous charges with possible drug charges pending lab results. He will face these charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.

On October 30, at 2:30pm, Bay Village Police were dispatched to 600 Dover Center Road to taken a stolen vehicle report. Officers arrived and spoke with the victim who reported that an acquaintance had stopped by his location to get a ride home. The victim let the suspect sit in the vehicle until he could get off of work. When the victim later went outside, the suspect and his vehicle were gone. The suspect returned the vehicle to the victim later the next day. Charges are pending further investigation.

On October 31, at 1:50am, Bay Village Police were on patrol in the area of Lake Road and Dover Center Road when they stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Police spoke with the operator, a 40 year-old Rocky River resident who appeared to be under the influence. The female refused to submit to roadside field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. On station, the female also refused to provide a breath sample to determine her blood alcohol content. She is facing charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.

On October 31, at 11:15 hours, Bay Village Police were dispatched to the 26000 block of Midland Avenue on report of a stolen vehicle. The victim had pulled into their friend's driveway and went inside for just a moment. The victim stated she had turned the vehicle off but had left the keys inside of the vehicle. When she came back outside a few minutes later, the vehicle was gone. Bay Village Detectives are investigating.
