



## **Bay Village Press Release**

**11/16/20**

On November 9, 2020 Bay Village were dispatched to the 26000 block of Normandy Road to assist with a domestic dispute. Officers learned that the 20 year-old son had begun moving out of the house but was creating a disturbance. Officers arrived and discovered that the son left in his father's vehicle without permission. Officers notified the son that he could be charged if he didn't return the vehicle. Officers later learned that the vehicle was found abandoned in North Ridgeville and that the homeowner had already arrived to get his car back.

On November 11, 2020 at 4:31pm, a Walker Road resident called Bay Police to report a fraud. Officers spoke with the female who reported that she was online when a pop-up stated her computer had been infected with a virus. The pop-up then gave her instructions for contacting "Microsoft Support." The scam artists continued to contact the homeowner who eventually went out and purchased \$3000 in gift cards. She then gave the gift card information to the con men. The homeowner is out the money and the Bay Village Detective Bureau is investigating.

On November 11, 2020 at 3:00pm, Bay Village Police were dispatched to the 300 block of Kenilworth Road on report of a burglary. Officers arrived and spoke with the victim. The victim told officers that she and her friend had been out of the home between 11:30am and 2:00pm, arriving home to find that someone had entered the home and had taken numerous items from the home. These items included numerous electronics including a Playstation 4 and a Virtual Reality headset. The case is being investigated by the Bay Village Detective Bureau.

On November 15, 2020 at 12:39am, Bay Village Police were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle on Lake Road at Queenswood Road for a moving traffic violation. Police spoke with the female operator, a 43 year-old Elyria resident who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. The operator failed field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. On station, the operator refused to submit to an Intoxilyzer test to measure her blood alcohol content. She is facing charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.
