



## **Bay Village Press Release**

**1/11/21**

On January 6, at 10:13pm, Bay Village Police stopped a vehicle on Bradley Road north of Wolf Road for multiple moving traffic violations. Police spoke with the male operator, a 48 year old Bay Village resident, who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. The male refused to take roadside field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. On station, the male refused to take an Intoxilyzer test to determine his blood alcohol content. He is facing charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.

On January 8, at 6:17am, Bay Village Police were dispatched to a Lindford Road address on report of a stolen vehicle. Police arrived and spoke with the victim. The homeowner reported that his 2009 Honda Pilot was stolen from his driveway in the overnight hours. The vehicle was left unlocked with the keys possibly inside the vehicle. In addition, the victim stated that his checkbook was left inside the vehicle. Bay Village Detectives are investigating.

On January 8, at 10:05am, Bay Village Police were dispatched to a Revere Drive address on report of a stolen vehicle. Police arrived and spoke with the victim. The homeowner reported that her 2016 Ford Edge was stolen from her driveway in the overnight hours. The vehicle was left unlocked and it is unknown if a set of keys were in the vehicle. Bay Village Detectives are investigating.

In addition to the stolen vehicles, numerous items were stolen from unlocked autos in the area on the same evening. Bay Village Police encourage residents to lock their vehicles, remove items from plain sight, and to take the keys out of the vehicles when not in use.

On January 8, at 9:45am, Bay Village Police were dispatched to take a Fraud report. Police spoke with the female victim, a Lake Road resident, who reported that she had received a letter from Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services indicating that she had filed for unemployment benefits. The victim reported that she had not applied but had been approved and even had been sent a PIN number mailed to her to access her account. The victim was told to contact the Dept. of Jobs and Family services about the incident and was referred to her bank and the credit bureaus to monitor her accounts. The Bay Village Detective Bureau is investigating.

On January 11, at 4:32am, Bay Village Police stopped a vehicle for a moving violation in the area of Electric Drive and Vineland Road. Police spoke with the female operator, a 23 year old Fairview Park resident, who appeared to be under the influence. The operator failed field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest for OVI. On station, the female submitted to an Intoxilyzer test which showed a .096 blood alcohol content. She is facing charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.
