



Bay Village Press Release

On February 26, at 1:38pm, a Lake Road resident called Bay Village Police to report that he was the victim of identity fraud. The victim reported that he had received calls from multiple finance companies. Upon speaking with a representative, the victim learned that someone had used his name to apply for a loan from Lending Tree. The Bay Village Detective Bureau is investigating.

On February 27, at 1:21am, a West Oviatt Road resident called police reporting that her husband was intoxicated and had left the home on foot. Officers arrived in the area and located the heavily intoxicated male. The male was uncooperative with officers and was placed under arrest. The male was transported to the Bay Village PD jail to sleep it off. He was charged with Disorderly Conduct – Intoxication and will face this charge at Rocky River Municipal Court.

On February 27, at 10:22am, Bay Village Police were dispatched to a Forestview Road address on report of a dog bite. Police arrived and spoke with the resident/victim who had a noticeable laceration on her hand. A squad was called to assess the injury. The victim told police that she was walking her dog when another dog came running from the neighbor's backyard. Police spoke with the owner of the attacking dog who reported that the dog escaped through a broken fence. The victim received stitches from the bite. The Bay Village Animal Control Officer is investigating.

On February 28, at 12:50am Bay Village Police were on patrol in the area of Bradley Road and Walker Road when they stopped a vehicle for several moving violations. Police spoke with the female operator, a 48 year-old Avon Lake resident who appeared to be under the influence. The operator failed field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. On station, the operator submitted to an Intoxilyzer test which showed a .094 blood alcohol content. The operator is facing charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.
