On May 13 at 9:41am, Bay Village Police were dispatched to the 28000 block of Osborn Road on report of a neighbor dispute. Officers arrived and spoke with the complainant who reported that her neighbor was out in the overnight hours, intoxicated, looking for a cat. Further, the intoxicated neighbor damaged some plants in their yard and removed surveyor's stakes. The neighbor in question denied these allegations and both parties were advised to stay away from each other.

On May 13 at 12:34pm, Bay Village Police were dispatched to the lobby of the police station to take a fraud report. Police spoke with the victim who reported he was attempting to sell a tractor on Craigslist. He made contact with the buyer who sent a check for thousands of dollars over the asking price. The property owner realized this was a scam and did not cash the check.

Residents are encouraged to be wary of online dealings. If you plan to make any sales, it is always safest to accept only cash or if it is a trusted source, accept only certified checks or money orders.

On May 14 at 12:48am, Bay Village Police were on patrol in the area of Clague Road and Lake Road when they found a vehicle that had crashed into the wooded area north of Lake Road. Police spoke with the male operator, a 32-year old North Ridgeville resident, who appeared to be under the influence. The male failed field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. On station, the male submitted to an Intoxilyzer test which showed a .192 blood alcohol content. The male is facing charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.

On May 16, at 12:42am, Bay Village Police were dispatched to the 26000 block of Knickerbocker Road on report of an unwanted guest at the residence. The victim reported that a female that he used to date had been calling him all day and was now at the house, intoxicated, knocking on his door and windows. Police arrived and spoke with the female who was eventually arrested for being drunk and disorderly. The intoxicated female was later released from jail to a sober adult and is facing charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.

On May 16, at 2:15am, Bay Village Police were on patrol in the area Lake Road and Dover Center Road when they stopped a vehicle for multiple moving violations. Police spoke with the male operator, an 18-year old Avon Lake resident, who appeared to be under the influence. The male failed field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. On station, the male refused to submit to an Intoxilyzer to test for his blood alcohol percentage. The male is facing charges in Rocky River Municipal Court.
