On 07/20/2021, at 0019 hrs, a BVPD officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation on Clague Rd. During the stop, it was discovered that the 43 yoa driver (East Cleveland resident) was driving on a suspended license. He was issued a citation for the violation and subsequently released at the scene. While speaking with him he admitted there was also a gun in the vehicle. The female passenger (40 yoa Euclid resident) admitted there was a loaded handgun underneath her seat, and the gun belonged to her. She was removed from the vehicle and the officer retrieved the weapon. The female did not have a permit to possess the loaded firearm and was arrested. She will face charges at RRMC.
