



## **Bay Village Press Release**

### **10/11/2021**

On 10/10/2021, at 0228 hrs, a BVPD officer stopped a vehicle on Lake Rd. near Park Dr. for a traffic violation. After speaking with the female driver, the officer suspected the driver had been drinking. Field sobriety tests were administered, and as result, the driver was arrested for OVI. The 24-ya Sheffield Lake resident will face charges at RRMCM.

On 10/08/2021, at 1005 hrs, a resident in the 31000 block of Tuttle Dr. reported she had been the victim of a scam. She received a call from someone claiming to be an Amazon representative. She was told her account had been compromised and she needed to download an app on her phone to correct the problem. After installing the app, and while still talking with them on the phone, her checking account had \$3,200 taken out of it. Police are investigating. BVPD reminds residents that any reputable company will not ask you to download apps for your personal banking information.

During the overnight hours of 10/05/2021, several cars were entered on Huntmere and East Oakland. Nothing of value was taken. BVPD reminds residents to remove valuable for your cars and make sure the doors are locked at all times.

On 10/06/2021 hrs, a resident in the 23000 block of East Oakland reported that her vehicle had been stolen overnight. The vehicle was parked in the driveway at 2330 hrs. When the owner went to bed, and gone at 0630 the next morning when she went to leave for work.

On 10/09/2021, at 1112 hrs, a resident in the 300 block of Oakmoor called BVPD to report a loud party in the area. The party was located and the residents were advised to turn down the music.

On 10/09/2021, at 0959 hrs, BVPD received a complaint from a Lakewood resident about a Facebook Messenger text he had received from someone claiming to be a Bay Village resident. There was a picture a female with a black eye indicating she had been assaulted. After investigating and speaking with the female, it was learned the female was fine and had not been assaulted. Her Facebook account had been hacked two weeks ago and she has not had access to it. She told police who she believed hacked her account. The alleged suspect was advised by police to cease all contact.
