

ORDINANCE NO. 13-91

AN ORDINANCE
**AMENDING CODIFIED ORDINANCE SUBSECTION 151.071(a) REGARDING
HOSPITALIZATION ELIGIBILITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the city and their employees recognize the costs of increasing health care and each party agrees to an employee's share of contribution to the cost of health care based on the COBRA rate as established on an annual basis by the City's Health Care Administrator noted in Section 151.071(a) below;

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Bay Village, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Codified Ordinance Subsection 151.071(a) which presently reads as follows:

“151.071 HOSPITALIZATION ELIGIBILITY.

(a) ~~*Effective January 1, 2012*~~, the Employees enrolled in the City's Health Care Plan who are not part of a collective Bargaining Unit shall contribute to the City ~~*ninety dollars (\$90.00) per month for single coverage and \$220.00 per month for family coverage.*~~ (Ord. 11-95. Passed 12-19-11.)”

be and the same is amended to read:

“151.071 HOSPITALIZATION ELIGIBILITY.

(a) The employees enrolled in the City's Health plan who are not part of a Collective Bargaining Unit shall contribute to the city as follows:

Effective October 1, 2013 – eight percent (8%) of the COBRA rate for single or family coverage.

Effective January 1, 2014 – nine percent (9%) of the COBRA rate for single or family coverage.

Effective January 1, 2015 – ten percent (10%) of the COBRA rate for single or family coverage.”

and current C.O. 151.071(a) is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. That this Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committee that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with law.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare, and

for the further reason for the daily operation of the Finance Department, wherefore this ordinance shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
