ORDINANCE

**ENACTING REVISED CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 125.29 SALE OF
PERSONAL PROPERTY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the City of Bay Village has possession of a variety of obsolete or abandoned property items that could be placed for auction, or otherwise disposed of; and

WHEREAS, the value threshold specified in the current Section 125.29 pertaining to disposal of moderately-valued property was last set at \$5,000.00 in 1988; and

WHEREAS, this Council wishes to facilitate responsible disposal of obsolete or abandoned property by reducing the time and expense required to dispose of said property;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Bay Village, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Codified Ordinances of the City of Bay Village are hereby amended by enacting revised Section 125.29 to read as follows:

“125.29 - Sale of personal property.


(a) Personal property not needed for municipal purposes, the estimated value of which is less than ~~\$10,000.00~~ ^{\$5,000.00}, may be sold by the Director having supervision or management thereof, or by their designee, in a manner determined by the Director having supervision or management thereof or by their designee, including but not limited to internet auction. If the estimated value of such property exceeds ~~\$10,000.00~~ ^{\$5,000.00}, it shall be sold as set forth in O.R.C. 721.15.

(b) Personal property not needed for municipal purposes, with minimal or no value as determined by the Director having supervision or management thereof, or by their designee, may be disposed of through refuse collection.”

SECTION 2. That this Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committee that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with law.



That this resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare, and further so said auction(s) may move forward expeditiously, wherefore this resolution shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
